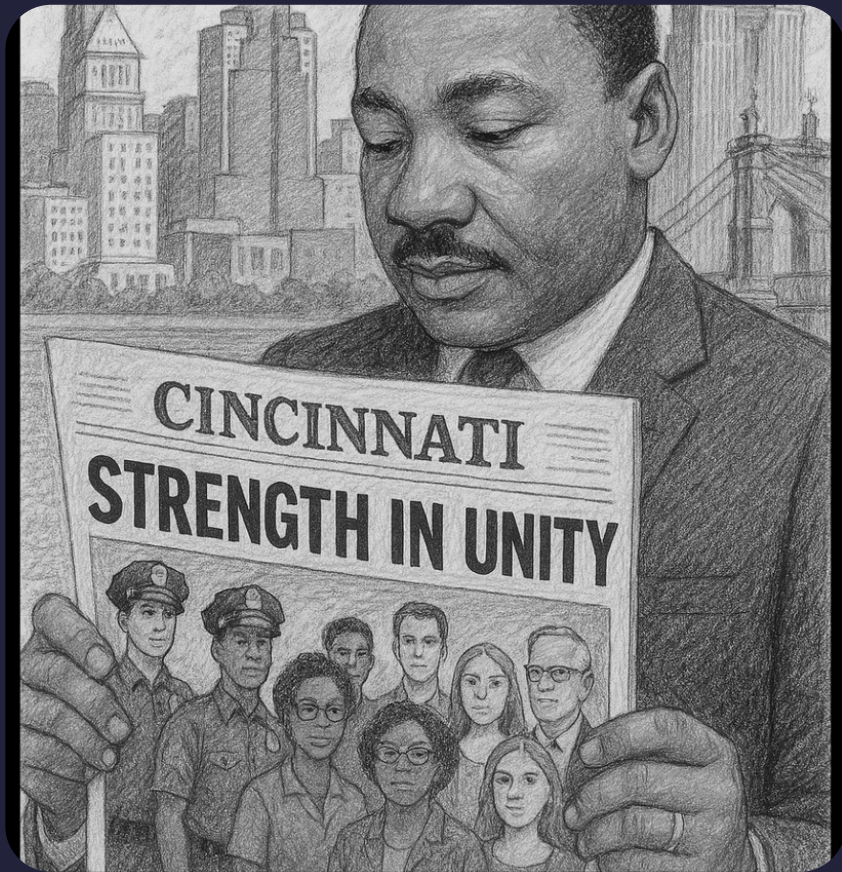

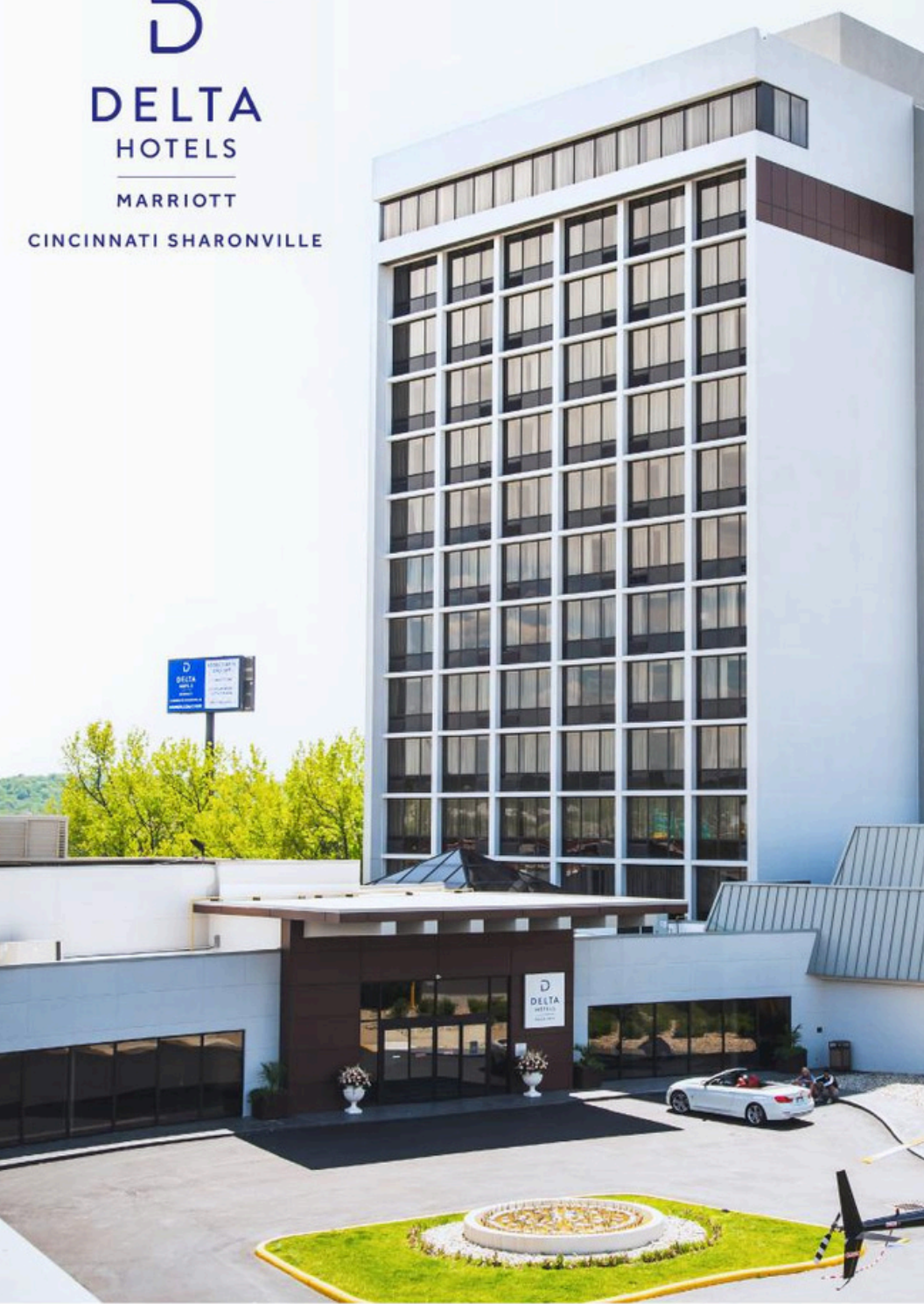

DR. MONICA J. POSEY

President

Cincinnati State Technical and Community College

Dr. Posey has been President of Cincinnati State for almost 10 years, focusing on building relationships to achieve the college's mission and expanding employer partnerships to address the tri-state's skills gap.

Dr. Posey holds a Doctor of Education from the University of Cincinnati, a Master of Business Administration from The Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania, and a Bachelor of Science from Cornell University. She completed PhD coursework in Quantitative Analysis and taught Statistics at UC for many years. She joined Cincinnati State after a business career with AT&T Company and held several positions before becoming president.

She is a graduate of the Cincinnati U.S.A. Regional Chamber 2010 Leadership Cincinnati class and serves on the boards of GRAD Cincinnati, Cincinnati Works, and the United Way of Greater Cincinnati. Community recognition includes the Business Courier Women Who Mean Business, the Greater Cincinnati YWCA Career Women of Achievement, and Cincy Magazine 100 Most Influential. Dr. Posey and husband, Rev. Dr. Michael J. Posey's community work also encompasses tutoring, mentoring, and endowed scholarships at Cincinnati State and Mount St. Joseph University. They have one daughter, Marchelle, and 3 grandchildren.



JUDGE DONTÉ JOHNSON

Judge Donte Johnson is a native of Cincinnati and a graduate of Cincinnati Public Schools, having attended Clark Montessori High School. He earned his undergraduate degree from Howard University and his Juris Doctorate from the University of Cincinnati, College of Law.

Judge Johnson was first elected to the Hamilton County Municipal Court on November 2, 2021. At the time of his election, he became the youngest Black judge in the State of Ohio. Prior to taking the bench, Judge Johnson operated a sole legal practice, focusing on criminal defense, plaintiff's litigation, and probate law. Earlier in his legal career, he served as a Public Defender and a Housing Attorney, advocating for individuals and families in need.

Highly active in the community, Judge Johnson is a motivational speaker and mentor to students and young attorneys. He holds memberships in the American Judges Association, Ohio Black Judges Association, National Bar Association, Ohio Bar Association, Cincinnati Bar Association, Black Lawyers Association of Cincinnati, Cincinnati NAACP, and the League of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC).

Judge Johnson's leadership and service have been widely recognized, including honors from the Cincinnati Business Courier's 40 Under 40, Who's Who in Black Cincinnati, the City of Cincinnati, and Upward Bound.



Dr Bryan Walker

Dr. Bryan Walker completed degrees at Wheaton College in Wheaton, Illinois from which he holds the Bachelor of Science in Communication, Cincinnati Christian University in Cincinnati Ohio, from which he holds a masters in theology and he completed his doctoral studies from United Theological Seminary in Dayton Ohio, where he recieved the Doctor of Ministry Degree.

He has served as an Adjuct Professor in Personal Finance on the collegiate level. He is the fourth Senior Pastor of the historic Bethel Baptist Church located in Walnut Hills.

Dr. Walker is married to a Cincinnati native, Kisha, and to this union were born two childern.
